Meeting the minimum criteria does not guarantee selection. Scholarships are awarded by a USF St. Petersburg Scholarship Committee including members from faculty and staff.

General Requirements:

- Full-time students unless otherwise noted (12 hours Undergraduate, 9 hours Graduate).
- Designated USF St. Petersburg students, in good standing with the Registrar, unless otherwise noted.
- The Grade Point Average (GPA) considered is based on the following, unless otherwise noted within the scholarship description:
 - First Time In College (FTIC) student entering USF St. Petersburg with a minimum 3.2 overall GPA, or
 - All other students (continuing, incoming transfer, or graduate) with a minimum 3.0 overall GPA.

GENERAL SCHOLARSHIPS - ACADEMIC

Demetrios Karamesoutis Endowed Memorial Scholarship

Full tuition paid for Fall and Spring each year.

1 undergraduate, 1 graduate award

- Renewable up to eight semesters (based on 12 credit hours each Fall and Spring for undergraduates, and 9 hours each Fall and Spring for graduates).
- Overall GPA will be verified at the end of each Spring for renewal consideration.
- Preference will be given to applicants of Greek heritage, when possible.

John B. Allwein Scholarship for Military Veterans

\$2,000 total, (\$1,000 Fall, \$1,000 Spring)

1 undergraduate or graduate award

- At least half-time enrollment (6 credit hours for undergraduate, 5 credit hours for graduate).
- Combat-wounded veteran with one or more severe disabilities. These may include, but are not limited to: loss of limb, loss of eye, brain injury, disfigurement, or other significant factors such as severe burns.
- Sustained combat injuries within the last 5 years.
- Priority for awarding the scholarship will be given to undergraduate or graduate USF St. Petersburg students who meet the scholarship criteria; if no USF St. Petersburg students who meet the scholarship criteria are identified, then undergraduate and graduate applicants from throughout the USF system who meet the scholarship criteria will be considered.
- *Additional requirement:* In addition to the general application essay, a separate 250-500 word typed essay covering the following topic:

Describe the nature of your injury and what personal challenges you have faced in order to return to school following your military service.

Jason C. Hill Memorial Scholarship

\$500 total, (\$250 Fall, \$250 Spring)

1 award

- Student must reside in South Pinellas County.

Lowell E. Davis Endowed Scholarship

Award amount based on availability of funds.

- Junior or Senior classification at the time of the award.
- Student must be seeking U.S. citizenship.
- One semester completed prior to Fall 2009 on the USF St. Petersburg campus.

USFSP Endowed Minority Scholarship

Award amount based on availability of funds.

- Preference will be given to USF St. Petersburg students from traditionally underrepresented ethnic groups.

USFSP Faculty/Staff Scholarship

Award amount based on availability of funds.

- Scholarship provided by USF St. Petersburg campus Faculty and Staff for USF St. Petersburg students.

Award amount based on availability of funds.

- Student must be enrolled in a Humanities or Liberal Arts major.

USFSP Retired Faculty & Staff Endowed Scholarship

\$750 total, (\$375 Fall, \$375 Spring)

1 undergraduate award

- Scholarship provided through the USF St. Petersburg Retired Faculty and Staff Association for USF St. Petersburg students.
- Junior or Senior classification at the time of the award.
- Minimum 3.2 Overall GPA.
- College of Arts & Sciences major. (Recipients are rotated between the Colleges of Business, Education, and Arts & Sciences each year).
- Preference given to a first generation college student.
- Additional requirement: In addition to the general application essay, a separate 250-500 word typed essay covering the following topic: **How will this scholarship impact your academic experience?**

Award amount based on availability of funds.

- Enrolled in "Investments" course in the College of Business.

\$750 total (only one semester of payment during Level 3 Internship)

2 awards

- Enrolled in a major within the College of Education.
- Senior classification at the time of the award.
- Must be completing the Level 3 Internship.
- Additional requirements: Include 2 letters of reference: one from the Level 1 or 2 Internship teacher, and the second from the SEA advisor showing involvement in the organization.

St. Petersburg Times Education Endowment

\$1,800 total, (\$900 Fall, \$900 Spring)

5 graduate awards

- Preference will be given to a Graduate student enrolled in the College of Education.
- Preference will also be given to students from traditionally underrepresented ethnic groups.

Amanda Cole Scholarship

\$1,250 total, (\$625 Fall, \$625 Spring)

2 awards

- St. Petersburg resident.
- St. Petersburg College transfer student with an Associate of Arts degree.
- Enrolled at least half time (6 credit hours undergraduate, 5 credit hours graduate).
- Additional requirements: Provide 2 letters of reference from SPC faculty.

Carl A. Gelin Memorial Scholarship

\$1,500 total, (\$750 Fall, \$750 Spring)

1 undergraduate award

- Preference given to USF St. Petersburg Honors Program participants, but all USF St. Petersburg students can apply.
- All majors, except those in the Social Sciences, will be considered.

Democratic Women's Club of Upper Pinellas County

Award amount based on availability of funds.

- Preference given to Political Science students. (Applicant should have plans to enter politics – not necessarily as an elected official, but some form of public service).
- At least half-time enrollment (6 credit hours undergraduate, 5 credit hours graduate).
- Additional requirement: In addition to the general application essay, a separate 250-500 word type-written essay covering the following topic:
Discuss your interest in politics, either as an elected official or in some form of public service, and how your field of study will contribute to that interest.

Donald Haney Memorial Scholarship

\$1,250 total, (\$625 Fall, \$625 Spring)

2 awards

- Sophomore, Junior, Senior, or Graduate student classification at the time of the award.
- Must demonstrate service to campus and/or community.
- Additional requirements: Copies of letters, certificates, or awards that demonstrate service to campus and/or community.

Frances G. Elvidge Scholarship

Full tuition paid for Fall and Spring each year.

10 undergraduate awards, 5 graduate awards

- Renewable up to eight semesters (based on maintaining full-time enrollment each Fall and Spring).
- Eligibility for yearly automatic renewal is determined by annually qualifying as “financially needy” according to the FAFSA application.
- Overall GPA will be verified at the end of each Spring for renewal consideration.

Julia Pauline Mansfield Scholarship

\$1,375 total, (\$688 Fall, \$687 Spring)

2 undergraduate awards

- Overall 3.2 GPA.
- Sophomore, Junior or Senior level at the time of the award.
- “Financial Need” for this scholarship is determined by the difference between limited financial aid awarded and semester tuition amount.

Lena M. Brown Book Scholarship

\$500 total, (\$250 Fall, \$250 Spring)

1 award

Raymund Foundation Endowed Scholarship

\$1375 total, (\$688 Fall, \$687 Spring)

4 awards

- Preference will be given to undergraduate students from traditionally underrepresented ethnic groups.

Scholarships are awarded by a USF St. Petersburg Scholarship Committee including members from faculty and staff. These scholarships are awarded on a competitive basis to the most commendable applicants. Academic merit and financial need criteria noted in the various scholarship offerings are used as minimum starting points for consideration. Criteria may be applied more rigorously, depending upon the size and qualifications of the applicant pool. **Meeting the minimum criteria does not guarantee selection.**

General Requirements:

- Full-time students for most scholarships, unless otherwise noted (12 hours Undergraduate, 9 hours Graduate).
- Designated USF St. Petersburg students, in good standing with the Registrar, unless otherwise noted.
- The Grade Point Average (GPA) considered is based on the following, unless otherwise noted within the scholarship:
 - First Time In College (FTIC) students entering USF St. Petersburg with a minimum 3.2 overall GPA, or
 - All other students (continuing, incoming transfer, or graduate) with a minimum 3.0 overall GPA.

Deadline

The application and all supporting documentation must be received by the Office of Financial Aid, 140 7th Avenue South, St. Petersburg, FL 33701. To be awarded a scholarship, you must be accepted into USF St. Petersburg for the term of the award. Application and supporting documentation, including letters of recommendation, **must be received by the Office of Financial Aid and/or postmarked by March 27, 2009 at 5:00 p.m.** in order to be considered. All supporting documentation should include your name and USF ID number. Remember to review individual scholarships for additional requirements.

Application Forms

Please type or print clearly in blue or black ink. Follow all directions carefully. Complete the Coversheet (PART C) and the Scholarship Application Form (PART D). Use our attached Checklist (PART E) to ensure you are submitting all required documents. Only complete application packets will be considered.

Additional Requirements

Some scholarships list “additional requirements” to submit along with the general application packet. These are notated in the Scholarship Descriptions (Part A), and on the Coversheet (PART C) with an asterisk (*). If a separate essay or statement is required for a particular scholarship, be sure to include the name of the scholarship on the page as well as your name and USF ID number.

Signature

The student must sign and date the completed application in the space provided in Part D, page 10. Your signature certifies that all information you provided on the application is correct.

Student Profile

Complete all parts of the student profile on the application.

Two (2) Letters of Recommendation

Each continuing USF St. Petersburg student is required to have two (2) letters of recommendation submitted from USF faculty or staff. If you are transferring from another institution or graduating from high school, request your letters from faculty or staff from that institution. Incoming graduate students may use professional references. To request a letter of recommendation, you may use our "Recommendation Form" in PART F or have your references submit personalized recommendation letters. *If you wish to have copies of your letters of recommendation, you will need to request them from your references. All recommendation letters require original signatures from your references.* **It is the responsibility of the scholarship applicant to make sure letters of recommendation are received by the Office of Financial Aid or postmarked on or before 5:00 p.m. on March 27, 2009.**

Essay(s)

Please submit a 250-500 word essay covering the topic listed on the application. Applicants applying for more than one scholarship should write only one essay, unless the specific scholarship requires you to answer additional essay questions.

Federal Financial Aid

If you are applying for Financial Need-Based Scholarships, you will need to complete a federal Financial Aid form called the Free Application for Federal Student Aid, [FAFSA](#), using USF's Title IV school code: 001537. Financial need for USF St. Petersburg Scholarships is determined using an indicator of family need, called the Expected Family Contribution (EFC), which is calculated using information obtained from the FAFSA. Estimated 2008 tax information can be used to complete the application. Apply between January 1, 2009 and March 1, 2009 to allow for receipt of the FAFSA application by the school prior to the scholarship deadline. Your scholarship application (for need-based scholarships) will not be complete until the school receives your FAFSA.

Notifications

The USF St. Petersburg scholarship applications will be reviewed by the USF St. Petersburg Scholarship Committee during April 2009. Expect to receive your notification of scholarship receipt between May and August 2009. **All communication will be via email.** Verify your designated financial aid email address under "Personal Information" in OASIS.

Scholarship criteria are based on University policy in conjunction with the intent of the individual donor(s). Scholarship awards may impact other sources of financial assistance administered by the University.

Renewable, Full-tuition Scholarships

If you are awarded the Academic (Merit-based) Demetrios Karamesoutis Scholarship, or the Financial (Need-based) Francis G. Elvidge Scholarship, you must maintain a 3.0 Overall GPA, and be enrolled for 12 credit hours Undergraduate or 9 hours Graduate per semester for Fall and Spring to be considered for automatic renewal. If you lose a full-tuition scholarship for failure to maintain the GPA or enrollment requirement, then you would lose the scholarship for the next academic year but may reapply in subsequent years.

Scholarship Recipient Expectations

As part of the award process, and in recognition of donor commitment to the University, recipients may be interviewed by donors or expected to attend donor "Thank You" events. This is an opportunity for scholarship recipients to thank donors for their generous support. We strongly encourage you to attend these events if requested to do so.

Scholarship Payment

Prior to payment of scholarship(s), students are required to submit:

- **Two (2) copies of a "Thank You" letter to the donor for each scholarship received**, prior to the term in which the award is scheduled to be paid. You will be notified via email as to how to address these letters and the deadline to submit them.
- **A signed copy of your "Letter of Acknowledgement,"** outlining the criteria for you to receive your scholarship. These criteria may include minimum GPA or required number of enrolled credit hours.
