## Student Statement of Responsibility

As an Early Admission Student, I understand that I must enroll as a full time college student (no less than 24 semester hours) and complete the high school courses required for a standard high school diploma. If attempting to meet the requirements for the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program, it is my responsibility to verify with the post-secondary counselor that the courses in which I am enrolled will meet the state's requirements. I also understand that it is my responsibility to submit to my high school guidance counselor an official transcript from the post-secondary institution upon the completion of each semester. Participation in the high school graduation ceremony is contingent upon meeting all high school graduation requirements and standards.

In some cases, highly capable and mature students find that the challenges associated with a university experience meet their needs more effectively than a final year in high school. If you are one of these students, the University of South Florida St. Petersburg can provide you with an offer of early admission to the University. Through the early admissions program, you may enter the university as a regularly enrolled, degree-seeking student prior to graduation from high school.

As an "early admission" student, you will work with our honors advisor to ensure that you take courses that are creditable toward your high school diploma and your baccalaureate degree. Since we commit our resources to providing each student with as much personal attention as possible, we must limit the size of our early admission classes. To be accepted as an early admission student you must:

1. have completed the equivalent of your junior year in high school (a minimum of six semesters) and require only one more year to complete all the requirements for a high school diploma
2. have proof of a SAT score of at least a 1200 with a Verbal component score of no less than 440 and a Quantitative component score of no less than 440; if you will be submitting ACT test scores, you must have a 27 EACT with no less than a 17 on the English component, a 18 on the Reading component, and an 19 on the Math component
3. have earned a 3.5 high school grade point average (as computed by the USFSP Office of Admissions and Records)
4. meet all the admission requirements for a regular degree-seeking student.

In addition to official high school transcripts and SAT or ACT testing results, you must also submit the following documents:

1. A completed SUS application for admissions with a \$30.00 non-refundable application fee
2. A personal letter outlining your reasons for pursuing an early admission opportunity at the University of South Florida St. Petersburg
3. A completed Supplemental Information for Early Admission Form (see page 1 of this document)
4. If you are a home schooled student, you must submit an official copy of your letter of intent with your home school district
5. A list of the credits that you need to graduate from your high school
6. Statement of Legal Compliance and/or a Copy of SACS Accreditation (to be completed by nonpublic high schools or home school parent). These forms are available through the Office of Admissions and Records.
7. You must notify Undergraduate Studies of progress and the desire to continue at the end of each semester.
